# HUET - HELICOPTER UNDERWATER ESCAPE TRAINING

ERGT Australia's Helicopter Underwater Escape Training course has been designed for personnel who regularly travel by helicopter to an offshore installation or facility. These individuals are typically operators in the oil and gas industry that require the skills and knowledge of what to do in an emergency situation where there is a need to exit a ditched helicopter and survive at sea for a period of time.

This course is delivered through classroom presentations, group discussions and practical demonstrations and exercises utilising specialised facilities and equipment. Trainees will be assessed through a written assessment and practical exercises.
